Regulations 732-R -1 – Student Transportation Safety Training

- 1.0 Student transportation safety training shall be provided for each student enrolled in grades k-12 to ensure that they are competent bus riders. The training shall consist of both classroom instruction and practical training using a school bus. Upon completion of training, a student shall be able to demonstrate knowledge and understanding of at least the following competencies and concepts:
 - 1.1 transportation by school bus is a privilege not a right;
 - 1.2 District policies for student conduct and school bus safety;
 - 1.3 appropriate conduct while on the bus;
 - 1.4 the danger zones surrounding a school bus;
 - 1.5 procedures for safely boarding and leaving a school bus;
 - 1.6 procedures for safe vehicle lane crossing; and
 - 1.7 school bus evacuation and other emergency procedures.
- 2.0 Student school bus safety training shall commence during school bus safety week. All students who are transported by school bus and are enrolled during the first week of school must demonstrate achievement of the school bus safety training competencies by the end of the third week of school. Students who enroll in a school after the first week of school and are transported by school bus shall undergo school bus safety training and demonstrate achievement of the school bus safety competencies within three weeks of the first day of attendance. The School District may deny transportation to a student who fails to demonstrate the competencies, unless the student is unable to achieve the competencies due to a disability.
- 3.0 The School will, to the extent possible, provide kindergarten students with school bus safety training before the first day of school.
- 4.0 The School will also provide student safety education for bicycling and pedestrian safety.
- 5.0 The District Transportation Office will provide materials, information, and other assistance to the School as needed in order to accomplish the above training.
