To better enhance student learning and limit distractions, all electronic devices will need to be locked in student lockers from 8:05-2:40. This includes time spent in the hallway and during lunch. If you need to contact your student, you may call the main office at 651-482-5280. If an electronic device is out during the day, it will be collected by the administration and may be picked up by your student at the end of the day. If the device has been taken away before, a parent or guardian will be asked to pick it up from the office.



"Restorative measures are a practical applicatio of youth development principles as summarized in the phrase 'Nothing about us without us.' Discipline, as much as any set of decisions made around children, should include the voices of the students: the person harmed, the person who did the harm, and the other students (and adults) affected by the harm. A restorative process provides the opportunity to practice decision-making in collaboration with others.

Restorative measures are not magic. They involve both easy and complex communication, and they require study, practice, trial and error, review and evaluation. They cannot replace the scope and sequence of a curriculum, the daily improvisation of a highly effective teacher, or the necessity of a healthy breakfast for learning. Social emotional learning, good nutrition and exercise, sleep, academics, and good relationships are all part of and partners in education.

Restorative measures can direct a school community- inside a school ... or outside a school... to provide the Circle that holds the children and keeps them safe."
