Harambee Elementary School is committed to the goal of providing quality education for every child in this district. We want to establish partnerships with parents and with the community. Everyone gains if school and home work together to support high achievement of our children. We can't do this job alone. Parents and families play an extremely important role as children's first teachers. Their support for their children and for the school is critical to their children's success at every step along the way.

Part I. Description of how the District and School will Implement Required Components

1. Harambee Elementary will engage parents and families who have Title I students in developing/revising the district and school Plan.

At the beginning of the school year during open house, we will present parents with a survey of communication options. In addition we will also ask for feedback on what they would like to see happen for the upcoming school year. Parents will be given the opportunity during the open house to sign up to participate in the PTO. Developing/revising of district and school plan will take place during PTO/Site Council meetings. A survey will be sent to all families to gain their input on the plan.

2. Harambee Elementary will convene an annual meeting, at a convenient time, when the parents of participating children are available to attend. The Title I annual meeting will inform parents about the Title I program, explain the requirements of parent and family engagement and the rights and responsibilities of the parents to be involved.

The annual Title 1 meeting will be held on Oct. 17th and 18th in the Media Center.

3. Harambee Elementary will offer flexible meeting times during morning, evening or weekends and may provide transportation, childcare or home visits.

Whenever we have scheduled meetings we will always provide ample time as well as multiple meeting times for parents to participate. Home visits will be made available based upon need. In addition, transportation will be made available upon request. Childcare will also be provided. We will coordinate meetings to line-up with other school events as an example, school conferences. Our PTO parent organization will be divided up into four ad hoc committees. Each ad hoc committee will be responsible for one school activity a year. The month that they are responsible for a particular activity is the month that they will meet. A major goal for us this year is to increase parent participation in the PTO. The Site Council will derive from the PTO organization. Meeting dates for the PTO and Site Council will be established based upon activity dates from the school calendar.

4. Harambee Elementary will involve parents in the planning and review of the school improvement plan and the joint development of the schoolwide plan when applicable. If the schoolwide plan is not satisfactory to the parents, submit comments on the plan when submitted to the district. [Section 1114(b)]

SIP will be available on the school's website and in hard copy in the main office (upon request). Families will be given an online survey where they can give the school feedback on the SIP. PTO and Site Council will review the SIP and provide any suggestions.

5. Harambee Elementary will provide assistance to parents of Title students:
- a. Timely information about programs offered to engage in their child's education.
 - b. An explanation of the curriculum, state and local academic assessments including alternate assessments, and the achievement levels of the state academic standards.
 - c. If they request, opportunities for regular meetings to hear their suggestions and participate in decisions related to their child's education.
