Part I. Description of how the District and School will Implement Required Components

- 1. Fairview Alternative High School will engage parents and families who have Title I students in developing/revising the district and school policy.

 If families cannot attend open house, a Zoom meeting will be held for individuals if needed.
- 4. Fairview Alternative High School will involve parents/families in the planning and review of the school improvement plan and the joint development of the schoolwide plan when applicable. If the schoolwide plan is not satisfactory to the parents, submit comments on the plan when submitted to the district. [Section 1114(b)]

Part II. Description of the Shared Responsibilities for High Student Academic Achievement

Fairview Alternative High School will jointly develop with Title I parents/families a school-parent compact that outlines how parents, the entire school staff, and students will share the responsibility
